Yoko Ng

Housing and workforce that single out true bilingual staff who are competent to serve the community. Provide bilingual staff more training to allow them to be able to serve the community. Screen based on job related language; recruitment shouldn't be limited to bilingual but those who are culturally competent. Upgrade capacity for those positions as well as recruiting, screening, and further training.

The teams that provide direct services need more bilingual staff with diverse backgrounds.

Star Vista has a huge population of bilingual staff, they are an example of an organization who has done it well.

Provide training for culturally sensitive populations.

Freida Edgette

Focused resources to take the caregiver roadmap (for parents and caregivers) and connect it to the continuum of care. Create visibility as well as articulating rights and expectations and who to call. It would be great to include a peer component as well.

Four phased process to take them through:

Get all stakeholders in the same room

Where are there linkages with different agencies?

Demystify the systems and provide heartfelt support with respect of where to go to get support for parents and caregivers

Navigating the complexity of the system

Look for patterns and trends

Then go to the most frequent tracks/scenarios and build the path and branch out from there

How do you make people aware of the programs available (not just parents and caregivers but teachers and others)?

Have a way to add information and share it with the community

Have a way to keep the information current

Not a call number and leave a message

Something that is useful

It should include testimonies and stories that would be video based

Gathering the stakeholders in the beginning would help with the process

BHRS in partnership with community partners

The custodian of it as it grows and changes

It would be a collaborative effort

Someone with strong media background

Design an app

Michael Lim There's a group of people doing this type of work, they are not yet mobilized, the Health Ambassador Program through the Office of Diversity and Equity (ODE). Health Ambassador Program for Youth run by StarVista: They are educated in various part of mental health This area of education could be expanded to include: Diversity and equity Alcohol and Other Drug Services Homelessness Justice Involved The subject topic for graduation is limited, maybe we want to expand that and that has a way of feeding into our peer support program. These people have lived experience This could be a pathway for workforce development Pathway for them to become Peer Support Specialist
