*Instructions for Public Comment During Hybrid Meetings

During hybrid meetings of the Commission on Disabilities (CoD), members of the public may address the Members of the CoD as follows:

*Written Comments:

Written public comments may be emailed in advance of the meeting. Please read the following instructions carefully:

- 1. Your written comment should be emailed to aeng@smcgov.org.
- 2. Your email should include the specific agenda item on which you are commenting, or note that your comment concerns an item that is not on the agenda or is on the consent agenda.
- 3. Members of the public are limited to one comment per agenda item.
- 4. The length of the emailed comment should be commensurate with the two minutes customarily allowed for verbal comments, which is approximately 250-300 words.
- 5. If your emailed comment is received by 5:00 p.m. on the day before the meeting, it will be provided to the Members of the CoD and made publicly available on the agenda website under the specific item to which your comment pertains. If emailed comments are received after 5:00p.m. on the day before the meeting, the CoD staff liaison will make every effort to either (i) provide such emailed comments to the CoD and make such emails publicly available on the agenda website prior to the meeting, or (ii) read such emails during the meeting. Whether such emailed comments are forwarded and posted, or are read during the meeting, they will still be included in the administrative record.

*Spoken Comments

In person Participation:

1. If you wish to speak to the CoD, please fill out a speaker's slip located by the meeting sign-in table at the entrance of the room. If you have anything that you wish distributed to the CoD and included in the official record, please hand it to the CoD staff liaison who will distribute the information to the CoD members and staff.

Certain functionality may be disabled in older browsers including Internet Explorer.
- 3. You will be asked to enter an email address and name. We request that you identify yourself by name as this will be visible online and will be used to notify you that it is your turn to speak.
- 4. When the CoD President or staff liaison calls for the item on which you wish to speak, click on "raise hand." Speakers will be notified shortly before they are called to speak.
