- Contracts team working very hard to finalize proposal for process, contracts to Board of Supervisors. They typically renew 300 contracts per year and manage over 600 contracts per year.
- Prop 1 will officially launch January 2026, so a lot is happening behind the scenes
 particularly at the state level to prepare for this. There was quite a lot of language in
 the legislation that left certain unknowns and up to the Department of Healthcare
 Services to define.
- State is currently conducting workgroups with County representatives. Dr. Jei Africa
 is a representative including other counties including Sacramento. Intent of
 workgroups are to be able to inform decisions that the state is making.

PRESENTATION

Substance-Use Services and Fentanyl Crisis Response (See attached slides)
Presented by: Mary Taylor Fullerton, Behavioral Health & Recovery Services' Alcohol and
Other Drugs

 Opioid is a national epidemic that is not unique to San Mateo County nor is it happening in certain pockets of the US. Rises in opioid overdoses/ deaths have increased across the nation.

- 109,000 deaths from opioids according to most recent data, 2022. 75% attributed to synthetic opioids.
- From an equity lens, Black Americans are suffering disproportionately.
- Key factor of opioids is the duration of effect meaning each time you will need higher levels to achieve the same effect.
- Fentanyl is a manufactured opioid drug uses for pain management and is 100x stronger than Morphine and 50x stronger than Heroin.
- Rise in opioid has been recorded in three waves so far. The upcoming 4th wave which is a little tricker to track data for is opioid + stimulants, mostly commonly cocaine.
- Youth & Fentanyl is also on the rise. Part of this is due to social media and the black market. You can order pills through Instagram and Snapchat, and expecting it to be a certain medication, put yourself at risk of accidentally consuming Fentanyl. There have been federal policy changes over the years to try to decrease accidental deaths.
- It is extremely difficult to tell what a counterfeit pill is and what is laced with Fentanyl. AOD encourages using Fentanyl test strips.
- Relapse rate for opioid use disorders without MAT (medication assisted treatment) is 85%. This means if a patient quits cold turkey, they have a 15% success rate.
- Recommended course for MAT is at least 6-12 months.
- Harm reduction also works. This includes language use, syringe exchange programs (not in this county, but in other neighboring counties), Naloxone (nasal spray that sends oxygen back to the brain).
- If you use Naloxone and the person didn't use opioids, nothing happens. So there is no harm to using Naloxone.
- As of 3/28, you can actually get Fentanyl test strips for free from the state.
- Up until Oct 2023, Narcan was not available over the counter. It is now available but about \$45. AOD offers them for free because they are ordered from the state.
- Maguire Jail in Redwood City has a free Naloxone vending machine. Only info it
 asks for is your Zipcode. AOD is working with senior community health center to get
 a smaller version at every BHRS clinic.
- Main way to access IMAT or other substance use services is to call the Access Call Center.

Public Comment on Presentation:

Comments and response to questions

- Q: If I'm under Kaiser, can I use IMAT at the Medical Center?
 - o A: Yes
- Q: Does Kaiser have something similar to this?
 - A: Yes, they have a statewide program called SUN (Substance Use Navigator). There are 67 sites across the state of California that have the SUN program including Sutter, Kaiser and Mills Peninsula. Since Kaiser has started the MAT programming, AOD has worked with people to help advocate for the SUN program.
- Q: If someone is privately insured, do we treat them first and eventually send them back to where they are covered?
 - A: Yes, we see them, treat them, and then we help provide advocacy and linkage to someone else.

- Q: Does this collaborate with AOT?
 - A: Yes, we sit in on the huddles with the emergency department to decide where someone is best suited. Because a lot of patients can't consent to treatment on the spot, we do a lot of on-the-spot triage support.
- Q: What is AOD's involvement with jails?
 - A: One staff goes to jail 3.5 days a week and they do screenings of individuals to see if they might need medication treatment.
- Q: How to get more folks educated and trained on Naloxone in the community? Potentially community emergency response teams are a group to partner with.
 - A: In April, 80 county librarians trained, and looking to partner with them in the future to host more community trainings.
