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Overarching Goals & Approaches

- Goals: Connect to longer term treatment; address behavioral health barriers to available housing options
- Approaches:

Prevention & Intervention services for individuals experiencing Behavioral Health (BH) conditions – MH & SUD.

Collaboration & Partnership with homeless services providers.

- Target populations: All ages, mild to moderate & severely mentally ill
- Referral: <u>HS_BHRS_HEAL@smcgov.org</u>





Homeless Engagement Assessment & Linkage (HEAL)

Overview of HEAL

- Model: HEAL clinicians assigned to specific regions in San Mateo; warm hand-off of HOT & HEAL
- Services: Comprehensive assessment, diagnosis, case management, therapeutic interventions, crisis interventions, psychoeducational groups, coordination for psych medications, providers meeting such as, multi disciplinary teams (MDTs)
- **Duration:** 9 months or more (grant-funding HEAL)



Overview of HEAL

- Service Locations: Encampments, shelters, transitional housing programs, telehealth, within San Mateo County
- Consent for Treatment: HEAL services are voluntary and consent is required beyond outreach & assessment
- Psychosocial Groups: Open to all residents "drop in"
- Medication Support: HEAL part-time psychiatrist
- Goal: Resolve mental health issues, or connect to longer term treatment programs

Behavioral Health Bridge Housing: July 2024 – June 2027 Encampment Resolution Funds: July 2024 – June 2027

Staffing: 7 FTEs HEAL Clinicians (with Limited Terms; 3 vacancies)

0.20 FTE HEAL Psychiatrist

1 FTE HEAL AOD Case Manager

Grants' Requirements: Service Specificities, Duration of Service, Target Populations





HealthCare for the Homeless (HCH)

BHRS HCH

- Goal: Identify and connect to needed health-care services
- Referral: From all shelters and HEAL team
- Services: Screening, case management, navigation and peer support
- Target Populations: Sheltered and unsheltered, mild to moderate SMI, all ages, all insurances.

- Homeless Outreach Team (HOT)
- Shelters
- Street Medicine, HIA, SMMC Primary Care
- Mobile dental, mobile crisis response teams
- MDTs
- Field Crisis Collaborative Care (FCCC)
