
DESCRIPTION

This watershed flows into the 'James V. Fitzgerald' Area of Special Biological Significance (ASBS) in San Mateo County, which has 5.5 miles of coastline. Offshore of this CCA is the James V. Fitzgerald State Marine Park. San Mateo County manages the Marine Park, which was preserved for its unique underwater habitat and extensive tide pools. This ASBS lies entirely within the Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary.

This watershed encompasses an array of land uses such as residential, rural residential (including horse properties), and agricultural. The beaches are well visited by the public. Halfmoon Bay Airport is directly east of the ASBS, and Pillar Point Harbor marina is located immediately south of the ASBS. This CCA includes San Vicente Creek, which drains a developed watershed and is chronically contaminated with coliform bacteria. There are 28 direct discharges by which urban runoff flows into the ocean, primarily from the residential area along the bluffs adjacent to the northern portion of the ASBS.
