What are electronic smoking devices?



What is in the aerosol?

- At least 10 chemicals identified in e-cigarette aerosol are on California's Proposition 65 list of carcinogens and reproductive toxins.
 - Acetaldehyde, Benzene, Cadmium, Formaldehyde, Isoprene, Lead, Nickel, Nicotine, N-Nitrosonornicotine, Toluene
- E-cigarettes contain and emit propylene glycol, a chemical that is used as a base in e-cigarette solution and is one of the primary components in the aerosol emitted by e-cigarettes.
 - Short term exposure causes eye, throat, and airway irritation
 - Long term inhalation exposure can result in children developing asthma



- South San Francisco
 - Prohibits use of electronic smoking devices in the following locations:
 - inside City buildings and within 20 feet of an entrance, exit, or operable window of a City building
 - City-owned parking structures and lots
 - City vehicles
 - City parks and recreation areas
 - open air public places designated by the City Manager
 - Downtown Core



- Daly City
 - Businesses that sell electronic nicotine delivery devices must obtain a Tobacco Retailer's Permit.
 - Vaping of nicotine is not allowed in areas where smoking of traditional cigarettes has been banned.



- Foster City
 - Electronic cigarettes are included in the definition of "smoking."
 - Any laws that pertain to smoking also include electronic cigarettes.



- Unincorporated San Mateo County
 - Electronic smoking devices are included in the "smoking" and "tobacco product" definitions.
 - Electronic smoking device retailers must apply for a Tobacco Retail License and are subject to tobacco stings. A fine will be issued if electronic smoking devices are sold to minors.



State Law

It is against the law for a person to sell or otherwise furnish an electronic cigarette to a person under 18 years of age.
