An application for a Revised Solid Waste Facility Permit (SWFP) for Shoreway Transfer Station was deemed complete and correct and acceptable for filing on October 31, 2024, by San Mateo County Environmental Health Services, the Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) for CalRecycle. This meeting is for all interested parties to provide comments on the proposed Solid Waste Facility Permit (SWFP). Interested parties may ask questions and provide comments. Comments may be submitted prior to the meeting, directly to Mr. Lucas Willis by postal mail or email. The meeting is strictly informational, and no official decision will be made at the meeting regarding the formal determination on the permit application.

Proposed changes to the SWFP include the following:

- A revision to the operating hours of the Transfer Station and Materials Recovery Facility from Monday Saturday 2 AM to 11 PM, Sunday 6 AM to 6PM to new hours of operation of 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.
- There will be no additional increase in permitted traffic volume of 1306 vehicles per day.
- There will be no increase in the permitted maximum tonnage of 3000 tons per day.

If you would like to comment on this project you may do so at the meeting, but if you are unable to attend the meeting, you may send your written comments via email (lwillis@smcgov.org) no later than **November 21**st **2024**.

Any appeal will be processed in accordance and pursuant to Public Resource Code sections 44307 and 44310 (PRC §44307). Appeals can only be made after the decision to issue or deny the permit revision has occurred. For additional information you may contact the LEA or review regulations on-line at <u>Public Resource Code Section 44307</u>.
